ADDRESSING COMMUNITY SPREAD

Substantial Spread

- Coordinate with local and state DPH health officials
- •Participate in contact tracing efforts and specimen collection efforts as directed by local health officials
- •Schools that are closed, remain closed. Implement distance/remote learning
- •Close off affected areas and if possible, wait 24 hours before cleaning and disinfecting.
- •Consider ways to accommodate needs of children, teachers/staff, and families at higher risk for severe illness

Minimal/Moderate Spread

- Establish and maintain communication with local and state DPH health officials
- •Participate in contact tracing efforts and specimen collection efforts as directed by local health officials
- •Implement enhanced social distancing measures
- •Post signage in classrooms, hallways, and entrances to communicate how to stop the spread. COVID-19 symptoms, preventative measures (including staying home when sick), good hygiene, and school/district specific protocols
- •Establish a protocol for students/staff who feel ill/experience symptoms when they come to school
- •Isolate and deep clean impacted classrooms and spaces
- •Consider ways to accommodate needs of children, teachers/staff, and families at higher risk for severe illness

Low/No Spread

- Establish and maintain communication with local and state DPH health officials
- •Participate in contact tracing efforts and specimen collection efforts as directed by local health officials
- •Implement enhanced social distancing measures
- •Post signage in classrooms, hallways, and entrances to communicate how to stop the spread. COVID-19 symptoms, preventative measures (including staying home when sick), good hygiene, and school/district specific protocols
- •Establish a protocol for students/staff who feel ill/experience symptoms when they come to school
- •Consider ways to accommodate needs of children, teachers/staff, and families at higher risk for severe illness



SCHOOL LOGISTICS AND PROTOCOLS

Substantial Spread

District/School Considerations:

- Use social media and other communications to inform parents, students, and staff about COVID-19 symptoms, preventative measures, good hygiene, and school/district specific protocols
- Implement distance learning, district device distribution and address connectivity needs.
- Encourage COVID-19 testing
- *Retrain staff on proper clean/disinfecting of frequently touched surfaces*

Minimal/Moderate Spread

District/School Considerations

- Face coverings are strongly recommended and expected for students and staff
- Move non-essential furniture and equipment out of classrooms to increase distance between student learning stations and turn desks in the same direction
- Provide hand soap and hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, paper towels, and no-touch or lidless trash cans in all bathrooms, classrooms, and frequently trafficked areas
- Post signage in classrooms, hallways, and entrances to communicate how to stop the spread. COVID-19 symptoms, preventative measures (including staying home when sick), good hygiene, and school/district specific protocols.
- *Regularly clean/disinfect frequently touched surfaces.*
- Each classroom desk (tops and bottoms) as well as hard surfaces and touch points will be sprayed with CDC approved cleaning agents. This will include the front office.
- Provide masks and other appropriate PPE to staff

MCS - Pathway to Recovery

Low/No Spread

District/School Considerations

- Teach and reinforce good hygiene measures such as hand washing, covering coughs, and face coverings.
- Provide hand soap and hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, paper towels, and notouch trash cans in all bathrooms, classrooms, and frequently trafficked areas.
- Post signage in classrooms, hallways, and entrances to communicate how to stop the spread. COVID-19 symptoms, preventative measures (including staying home when sick), good hygiene, and school/district specific protocols.
- Regularly clean/disinfect frequently touched surfaces.
- *Clean/disinfect frequently touched surfaces at least daily.*
- Allow students and staff to bring hand sanitizer and face masks/coverings to use from home
- Teachers, students, visitors and other school personnel shall sanitize their hands each time they enter and exit a classroom.
- Conduct deep cleaning of schools prior to students/staff returning.



TRANSPORTING STUDENTS

Substantial Spread

District/School Considerations:

• School buildings are closed; buses used to deliver meals to students and families

• Reduce contact by delivering a week's worth of meals during a designated time (ex: delivering a week's worth of meals every Monday)

Minimal/Moderate Spread

District/School Considerations:

•Provide hand sanitizer for students and bus drivers

•Provide face masks for bus drivers; allow students to wear face masks/coverings

•Screen students and bus drivers for symptoms of illness and utilize spaced seating (to the extent practicable)

•Eliminate field trips

•Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces on the bus daily

•Establish protocols for bus stops, loading/unloading students to minimize congregation of children from different households

Low/No Spread

District/School Considerations:

Implement standard operating procedures while taking preventative measures such as:

- Provide hand sanitizer for students and bus drivers
- Allow bus drivers and students to wear face masks/coverings
- *Limit field trips (to areas of limited/low transmission)*
- Inspect buses prior to students returning and as part of a regular rotation
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces on the bus at least daily
- Air out buses when not in use



ENTERING SCHOOL BUILDINGS

Substantial Spread

School buildings are closed; the district will require only that essential staff report in-person to carry out functions that are absolutely necessary.

District/School Considerations:

•District/school leaders must remain vigilant and purposeful as they determine roles, responsibilities, and reporting requirements for staff, refraining from blanket reporting requirements

•District/school leaders should leverage virtual tools and platforms wherever possible to conduct essential business and keep in-person reporting to an absolute minimum during school closures)

Minimal/Moderate Spread

District/School Considerations:

•Post signage in classrooms, hallways, and entrances to communicate how to stop the spread. COVID-19 symptoms, preventative measures (including staying home when sick), good hygiene, and school/district specific protocols.

•Establish a protocol for students/staff who feel ill/experience symptoms when they come to school

•Mark spaced lines to enter the building and designate entrance and exit flow paths

Low/No Spread

District/School Considerations:

Implement standard operating procedures while taking preventative measures such as:

•Hand sanitizer stations for students and staff

•Limit unnecessary congregations of students and staff

•Post signage in classrooms, hallways, and entrances to communicate how to stop the spread. COVID-19 symptoms, preventative measures (including staying home when sick), good hygiene, and school/district specific protocols Establish a protocol for students/staff who feel ill/experience symptoms when they come to school.

•Establish a protocol for visitors: calling the front office before entering, screening visitors, requesting use of face coverings/masks, etc. Establish a protocol for student pick up/drop off: staggered entry and release (by grade, class, or bus numbers), marked spacing for pickup.



SERVING MEALS

Substantial Spread

District/School Considerations:

School buildings are closed.

• Practice established social distancing protocols to the greatest extent practicable

• Provide PPE to participating staff

• Reduce contact by using the curbside and bus stop service. Distribute 7 days worth of meals Monday through Friday

• Distribute printed instructional packets/ materials and district/school communications along with meals

• *Reduce person-to-person contact by using multiple locations to provide essential services.*

Minimal/Moderate Spread

District/School Considerations:

- Allow student hand washing before and after meal service
- Provide hand sanitizer for students and staff
- Use disposable plates, utensils, etc.
- Mark spaced lines to enter the cafeteria and serving lines (to the extent practicable); designate entrances and exit flow paths; stagger use
- Conduct cleaning of cafeterias and high-touch surfaces throughout the school day

Alternative Serving Models:

- Serving meals in classrooms
- Serving meals in cafeterias with spaced serving lines (marked on floors)
- Spaced seating (utilize outdoor space as practicable and appropriate)
- Longer meal periods for more staggered meal delivery (utilizing state seat time waiver to extend meal periods)
- Consider pre-packaged boxes or bags for each student instead of traditional serving lines. Avoid sharing of foods and utensils.

MCS - Pathway to Recovery

Low/No Spread

District/School Considerations:

Implement standard operating procedures while taking preventative measures such as:

• Provide hand sanitizer for students and staff

• Allow students and staff to wear face masks/coverings while in large group gatherings

• Conduct cleaning of cafeterias and hightouch surfaces throughout the school day



TRANSITIONING

Substantial Spread

School Buildings Are Closed.

Minimal/Moderate Spread

District/School Considerations:

- *Limit mixing between groups (to the extent practicable)*
- For class changes and other transitions throughout the school day:
- Provide additional time for transitions (utilizing state seat time waiver to extend transition period)
- Designate areas in the hallway (i.e. lanes) as flow paths to keep separated
- Plan staggered class (ex: by hall, odd/even room numbers, grade/ discipline) changes to decrease number of students in hallways at one time
- Have the same group of students stay with the same staff (all day for young children and as much as feasible for older children)

Low/No Spread

District/School Considerations:

Implement standard operating procedures while taking preventative measures such as:

- Allow students and staff to wear face masks/coverings while in large group gatherings
- Conduct cleaning of hallways and hightouch surfaces throughout the school day
- Designate areas in the hallway (i.e. lanes) to walk to keep students separated (to the extent practicable)



CONDUCTING LARGE GROUP GATHERING

Substantial Spread

School buildings are closed

Abide by the maximum number of people allowed to congregate as defined by the Governor's current statewide Executive Order

Minimal/Moderate Spread

District/School Considerations:

• Abide by the maximum number of people allowed to congregate as defined by the Governor's current statewide Executive Order

• Discourage the congregation of students in parking lots and common areas

• Stagger the schedule for large group gatherings (i.e. recess and school meals)

• Identify and utilize large spaces (i.e. gymnasiums, auditoriums, outside spaces – as weather permits) for social distancing

•Follow Alabama High School Association guidelines for sporting events and practices.

Low/No Spread

District/School Considerations:

Implement standard operating procedures while taking preventative measures such as:

• Provide hand sanitizer for students and staff

• Allow students and staff to wear face masks/coverings

• Limit unnecessary congregations of students and staff

• Follow Alabama High School Association guidelines for sporting events and practices



SUPPORTING TEACHING & LEARNING

Substantial Spread

School Buildings Are Closed. District/School Considerations:

•Implement a robust Distance Learning Plan

•Distribute printed instructional packets and district/school communications along with meals; designate and communicate collection/drop off points

Minimal/Moderate Spread

District/School Considerations:

Survey families to gauge which students may want to conduct their schooling virtually for the 2020-2021 school year

Educational Option For Families

1. Hybrid /Blended Model

A blend of both traditional classroom instruction and online learning activities with alternating days.

Alternating Days: Students will be divided into 2 groups. Groups will alternate face-to-face and virtual instruction during the week.

For Example: Group A will attend Monday and Wednesday and work virtually the remainder of the week. Group B will attend Tuesday and Thursday and work virtually the other days of the week. Friday will be a professional development day for employees and e-learning day for students

2. Virtual Learning

Students will receive individualized instruction at home utilizing our learning management system. Students will be expected to be engaged in digital learning activities based upon their typical school schedule.

Additional Information

Grades will be given for each learning option. Learning options are not interchangeable Students will be able to change learning environments at the beginning of each 9 weeks

Online tutorials and instructional videos will be available for parents to help them navigate the learning portals

SPECIALIZED INSTRUCTION

Substantial Spread

School buildings are closed. District/School Considerations:

Services and supports will be provided through teletherapy options developed in collaboration with parents and based on services in the IEP/EP plan. Specially designed instruction and related services will utilize virtual instruction and teletherapies

Services and supports that may be provided virtually include: Speech Therapy Language Therapy Occupational Therapy Physical Therapy Small group/individual social skills instruction

• *ELL supports will be provided remotely as appropriate*

• SEL programming will be incorporated into regular instruction

Minimal/Moderate Spread

District/School Considerations:

•Services and supports will be provided based on the IEP/EP/504 plan. Some specially designed instruction and related services will utilize virtual instruction and teletherapies due to rotating schedules

Services and supports that may be provided virtually include: Speech Therapy Language Therapy Occupational Therapy Physical Therapy Small group/individual social skills instruction

• ELL supports will be provided as appropriate

• SEL programming will be incorporated into regular instruction and delivered through teacher-directed or eLearning activities

Low/No Spread

District/School Considerations:

Special Education support services based on the IEP/GEP

504 Plan accommodations implemented per plan requirements

ELL supports provided based on district and individual student plans

SEL programming will be incorporated into regular instruction



EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Athletics, Band, Clubs, Before & After School Activities

Substantial Spread

District/School Considerations:

School buildings are closed.

Abide by and adhere to the maximum percentage of people allowed to congregate as defined by the Governor's current statewide Executive Order.

Minimal/Moderate Spread

District/School Considerations:

• Abide by and adhere to the maximum percentage of people allowed to congregate as defined by the Governor's current statewide Executive Order.

• All gatherings, events, and extra-curricular activities shall maintain appropriate and responsible social distancing. This includes limited tickets and seating.

• Follow Alabama High School Athletic Association (AHSAA) guidelines for sporting events and practices

• All facilities, equipment, instruments, uniforms, etc. should be thoroughly cleaned, disinfected, washed or wiped down after each use

• Have adequate cleaning and sanitizing supplies at an event for participants and attendees, including hand sanitizing stations.

• If a student is experiencing symptoms- isolate, supervise and call the parent/guardian

• Adhere to Transporting Students guidelines even if utilizing charter buses

Low/No Spread

District/School Considerations:

Implement standard operating procedures while taking preventative measures such as:

• Follow Alabama High School Athletic Association (FHSAA) guidelines for sporting events and practices.

• All equipment, instruments, uniforms, etc. should be washed or wiped down after each use.

• Signs to remind attendees of responsible social distancing (public restrooms, concessions, seating) and allow for multiple exit points.

• Have adequate cleaning and sanitizing supplies at an event for participants and attendees, including hand sanitizing stations

• Limit unnecessary congregations of students and staff

• Allow students and staff to wear face masks/coverings while in large group gatherings

• If a student is experiencing symptoms- Isolate, Supervise and call the parent/guardian



STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

Substantial Spread

School buildings are closed. District/School Considerations:

School Counselors, and Behavior Health Counselors will be available to:

• Make contact with students receiving small group or individual services

- Serve as resources to families and for distance
- Wellness checks as warranted
- Provide virtual guidance curriculum
- Continue to monitor high risk student needs
- Provide academic guidance and support
- Facilitate 504 meetings

Minimal/Moderate Spread

District/School Considerations:

- Assess Emotional Status
- Student Risk Screening Scale Internalizing/Externalizing
- Support Trauma Sensitive Training
- Incorporate Social Emotional Learning Elem/Secondary Guidance Curriculum

- Provide academic guidance and support

PROTECTING VULNERABLE POPULATION

Substantial Spread

Elderly individuals and/or individuals with serious underlying health conditions, including high blood pressure, chronic lung disease, diabetes, obesity, asthma, and those whose immune system is compromised such as by chemotherapy for cancer and other conditions requiring such therapy.

Minimal/Moderate Spread

District/School Considerations:

•Survey at-risk staff members to gauge their intentions in returning to work while maintaining confidentiality consistent with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and other applicable federal and state privacy laws

•Survey families with vulnerable children to gauge their intentions in returning to a traditional school

•Provide remote/distance learning opportunities for vulnerable student populations in consultation with parents and public health officials

•Consult with local board attorneys and district human resources officials to offer special accommodations (such as an alternative teaching assignment) for personnel who are members of vulnerable populations

•Adhere to FERPA and HIPPA

requirements

•Adhere to state and federal employment law and extended leave allowances

Low/No Spread

District/School Considerations:

Implement standard operating procedures while taking preventative measures such as:

• Establish a point-of-contact with the local health department

• Identify local COVID-19 testing sites

• *Provide PPE to vulnerable students and staff as appropriate*

• Allow vulnerable students to complete their coursework virtually

• Allow vulnerable students and staff to wear PPE throughout the school day (to the extent practicable)

• Establish a process for regular check- ins with vulnerable students and staff

• Allow an early transition for vulnerable students to go to classes

• Limit large group gatherings/ Interactions for vulnerable students and staff

When A Child, Staff Member, or Visitor Becomes Sick At School

• Digital Temperature Check and check for other symptoms

• Work with school administrators, school nurses, and other healthcare providers to identify an isolation room or area to separate anyone who exhibits COVID-like symptoms.

• School nurses and other healthcare providers should use Standard and Transmission-Based Precautions when caring for sick people. See: What Healthcare Personnel Should Know About Caring for Patients with Confirmed or Possible COVID19 Infection

• Contact parent/guardian/emergency contact to arrange for an individual who is sick to go home or to a healthcare facility.

• Notify local health officials, staff, and families immediately of a possible case while maintaining confidentiality consistent with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and other applicable federal and state privacy laws.

• Close off areas used by a sick person and do not use before cleaning and disinfection. Ensure safe and correct application of disinfectants and keep disinfectant products away from children.

• Advise sick staff members and children not to return until they have met Jefferson County Health Department criteria to discontinue home isolation

• Inform those who have had close contact to a person diagnosed with COVID-19 to stay home and follow Alabama Department of Health guidance if symptoms develop. If a person does not have symptoms, follow appropriate Alabama Department of Health guidance for home quarantine
