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Roadmap to Return

At a Glance

Students and staff will return to campus with increased health and safety measures in order to combat the effects of COVID-19 in our schools. District leadership has engaged in meaningful conversations with health authorities to create a reopening plan with safety and health at the forefront. School is anticipated to reopen on **Tuesday, January 19, 2020** with the following plan:

- **Traditional School**
 - **Self-contained/Special needs students**
 - January 19, 2020 with modified schedule
 - A-Z (Monday -Thursday)
 - Friday (E-Learning, Social & Emotional Learning, and Sanitation)
 - **General Students**
 - January 19, 2020 with modified schedule
 - A-L (Monday & Wednesday)
 - M-Z (Tuesday & Thursday)
 - Friday (E-Learning, Social & Emotional Learning, and Sanitation)
 - Students must attend school remotely on days they are not scheduled to be on campus
- **Remote Students** will be enrolled in our Acellus online program or utilize Google Classroom with direct contact with their classroom teacher on their assigned period or additional times specified by the teacher. We will follow our regular schedule Monday-Thursday:
 - Homeroom-7:50-8:15am
 - 1st-8:20-9:35am
 - 2nd-9:40-10:55am
 - Intervention/Lunch-11:00am-12:20pm
 - 3rd-12:25-1:40pm
 - 4th-1:45-3:00pm

- Teachers will provide tutoring and online assistance by appointment only during their prep or any other designated time.

Face Coverings

Face coverings will be required based upon CDC guidelines, state mandates and guidance from Midfield City Schools. Social distancing is not always possible in school settings; therefore, students and staff should purchase reusable masks and wear them while on campus.

Temperature Checkpoint/Social Distancing

All students must go through a security checkpoint before 8am or check-in through the main office after 8am. Temperatures will be checked upon student entrance in the main building. Students with abnormal temperature screenings will not be permitted to remain in the learning environment. Parental contact will be made immediately and the student will be placed in our school's quarantine station. Students will practice social distancing from the arrival on campus through departure. Students will not be able to congregate at the lockers between, before, or after class. Grab-and-go breakfasts and lunch will be available and will be eaten in the classrooms in order to reduce opportunities for exposure.

Limited Access to Visitors and Volunteers

It is essential to create a healthy and safe environment by limiting potential COVID-19 exposure whenever possible. Midfield High School will be limiting access to visitors and volunteers to appointments only.

Hand Sanitation Stations

Hand sanitation stations will be in each classroom throughout the building. Students and staff will work together to ensure everyone is contributing to a healthy environment by wiping surfaces after classroom instruction is complete. Students are encouraged to bring their own (travel size) hand sanitizer.

Classroom Modifications

Student desks will be appropriately spaced apart when possible. Students' seats will be arranged in a traditional model.

Controlled Movement Patterns

To limit COVID-19 exposure and promote social distancing, students will transition to class with the guidance of adults where possible throughout the day, utilizing controlled movement patterns based on signage throughout campus.

Common Area Modifications

Students will be monitored in all common area locations to encourage social distancing practices. Elective classes such as physical education, art, and music will adhere to social distancing while limiting collaborative activity and shared resources.

Meal Service

Students will receive breakfast meals grab-and-go style and will eat in their classrooms. Students will eat lunch grab-and-go style and in their designated classrooms.

Mass Gatherings

For the safety of staff and students on campus large gatherings will not be permitted until further notice.

Extracurricular Activities and Athletics

Technology

Students are required to bring school-issued devices to school each day. Students who opted not to get a school-issued device should bring their own.

- Laptops should be fully charged before coming to school
- Parents are encouraged to purchase headphones for student use
- Cell phones will not be permissible for use in the classrooms. They must be turned off and stored in the student's backpack until the dismissal of school.

Backpacks

- Students will still go through a security checkpoint
- All backpacks and purses will be checked daily

Water Bottles

The school will provide bottled water to students during specific times during the school day to reduce COVID-19 exposure that may occur from using the water fountain.
