Internet Accessibility

Please be prepared to continue to assign lessons until further guidance is given to us by ALSDE.

Non-Digital Curriculum

For students who do not have access to devices or internet service, alternate work assignments will be compiled by teachers at each school per classroom and/or department. Alternate assignments include, but are not limited to paper work assignments, project-based learning assignments, Zoom interactive classes, etc. These assignments should be available for distribution Thursday, March 19, 2020. Please plan for long term assignments beginning April 30, 2020, due to the unpredictability of the current situation.

Report Cards

As you know, the 3rd nine weeks grading period ended on March 11, 2020. Since school is tentatively set to resume April 6th, we will plan to distribute report cards the week of April 13th.

ACAP Summative/ACT Make-Up

The ACAP Summative was scheduled to begin the week of March 30th and the ACT make-up testing was scheduled for March 31st. Since we will not be in school, we will wait for directives from the Alabama State Department of Education. To date, there has been no correspondence. I will communicate with school leaders and building test coordinators as soon as information is available.
