Does the child demonstrate problems or difficulties in any of the following areas?

Development

- Uneven or no movement
- Shows no interest in toys
- Physically overactive or passive
- Clumsy, makes a lot of mistakes
- Limited strength, vitality or alertness

Behavior

- Restless
- Need for constant movement
- No understanding of real dangers
- Experiences drastic mood swings

Self-Help

Children develop at different rates. Most children will show steps toward independence during toddler years. Some concerns may be:

- Does not try to feed self
- Rarely expresses wants or desires
- Shows little or no independence
- Gives up too easily
- Depends on others to care for personal needs

Help is available

Special services are available to eligible infants, children and young adults identified with a disability, who may be experiencing difficulties in one more more of the following areas:
